Food Security For All

In 2023, AdkAction **doubled the number of families** we help to put local, fresh food on the table in the Central and Western Adirondacks, Champlain Valley and Tri-Lakes region.

We teamed up with leaders in Hamilton County to help give families with young children monthly stipends to spend on staple items at local grocery stores, helping give our youngest eaters the best chances for good health and a great life.

Clean Water Safe Roads

We transformed our road salt reduction work into a regional movement for change: nearly tripling the number of highway crews we train for salt and sand reduction practices and launching an outreach campaign to educate thousands of residents and visitors about the importance of protecting our clean water.

Pollinator Conservation

Over the past three years, we have exponentially expanded pollinator habitat through our Adirondack Pollinator Project's native plant and seed distribution efforts. This year, our Library Buzz program and first Adirondack Pollinator Festival engaged more families and youth, equipping them with the knowledge and resources to become ongoing advocates for pollinator conservation.

Regenerating Soils

Our Compost for Good team educated hundreds of individuals, farmers, and business owners about composting to regenerate soils and keep food waste out of landfills. In 2023, we outfitted the Towns of Newcomb and Minerva with a community-scale composter to serve the two municipalities, cutting costs and greenhouse gas emissions.

Broadband and Cellular Coverage

We reached significant milestones in driving funding toward the North Country for broadband access and are increasing our efforts to expand cellular coverage to the frontcountry.
